Information for Delegates

Thank you for your interest in the 3rd Conference of the International Association for Tourism Economics, which will be held in Kimmeridge House at Bournemouth University's Talbot Campus, from Monday 4th to Thursday 7th July 2011.

Travel and Accommodation

The conference will take place at the University's Talbot Campus ([map of Talbot Campus](#)). A shuttle bus will run from the Hermitage Hotel ([Hermitage Hotel](#)) in Bournemouth town centre to the campus in the morning, and back to the Hermitage Hotel at the end of each day. The conference web page contains links to hotels that are near to the shuttle bus pick-up and drop-off points.

You are free to choose other accommodation, in which case you should choose to stay in Bournemouth town centre if you want to use the arranged shuttle service. It is recommended that you book as soon as possible, as Bournemouth is a very busy holiday destination.

Bournemouth has its own airport, with flights from a limited number of European destinations. Bournemouth airport is 8km from Bournemouth town centre, with bus and taxis available at the airport.

Other airports in the UK are well connected to Bournemouth by rail, and have flights from more destinations. These are Southampton Airport (45km), London Gatwick (127km), London Heathrow (130km), London Luton Airport (166km), Birmingham International Airport (192km), London Stansted Airport (235km), Manchester Airport (294km).

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Conference dress attire

The dress attire for the conference and meals is smart casual. The average daily temperature in Bournemouth in July is 22°C, with around 25% chance of rain on any day. Sunset times are around 21.20 hours in early July.

Information for delegates who are presenting papers

All contributed paper sessions will be chaired. Where the papers presented in a session share a common theme, the session Chairs will be encouraged to give a brief presentation at the start of a session to introduce the literature around the topic covered.

Delegates who have submitted full papers will have a 30 minute time-slot allocated to their presentation. You should make your formal presentation in 15 minutes, with 5 minutes for a discussant to make comments on the paper, and 10 minutes for questions and discussion with the audience. Delegates who have submitted abstracts but not full papers may be allocated shorter time-slots.

Presenters will be able to email their PowerPoint presentations in advance, in which case the presentation will already be loaded prior to the conference on the computer in the room in which they are presenting. They may also bring their presentation on a USB stick, in which case they should arrive at their room in advance of their session start time.
